

After two difficult Corona-Years, finally our partner school Milele Elimu Centre has some normality ahead of them. The Kenyan government managed to make up the lost school time during the Corona-Pandemic. After the last two very stressful years, the curriculum is back to normal and the children can focus on the essential: studying for a better future.

Our students already have several role models, as seven of our former primary students were accepted to Kenyan Universities and we are able to support them financially. This is also known in the village and the families are extremely proud of what their children have accomplished. We do hope that some of our next secondary graduates score high enough grades to be continuing to a University. We are on a very good track on improving the educational level in the neighbouring Slums.

A highlight of last year was certainly the trip to Kenya. Half of the associate members including some friends were part of the group. For some among the group it was the first time to Kenya and they were delighted with the many different impressions. The complete group visited our partner schools. The program was packed from an association perspective: a personal exchange with the supported secondary- and university students, a full-day workshop with the employees of the Milele Elimu Centre as well as the visit of the new parcel of land. We want to advance the efforts in building our new school in 2023. Smaller works which do not require an official concession are currently in planning and will be started in 2023. For the construction of the main building we still need the official concession as well as to secure the funding. Even though we already have received a lot of funds dedicated to the construction of the building, we still lack around half of the budgeted amount. We are grateful for every little support!

Glass bead embroidery in particular, is highly popular among people of all ages. It is used to create various accessories, especially bracelets. From a young age, most children learn this craft through their circle of friends. In school, bracelets are now complemented with additional materials like leather. The children proudly show us their new self-made bracelets!





Comments on finances:

Own Events:

The transfer of third-party funds from the card game event in November 2021 was slightly delayed and only deposited to our bank account in January 2022. In June, the earnings from the summer event with Wild & Solivo, as well as a flea market event, are visible. The earnings in August result from another joint event at the outdoor bar Triebguet. In October, the amounts from two additional flea market events were deposited, and in November, the proceeds from our card game event were credited.

Christmas Campaign:

A total of CHF 3,238.49 has been raised through our Christmas campaign for the construction of our school building. Two donors have already transferred a sum of CHF 60.00 for the Christmas campaign during the year.

Personnel Costs in Kenya:

As of the end of December 2022, the funded staff includes a school principal, 2 kindergarten teachers, 13 primary school teachers, 2 cooks, a facility manager, and a secretary. Throughout the year, various interns were hired, who are university students but found temporary employment with us during their long semester breaks or before starting their studies. For example, our secondary school graduates were employed by us, gaining work experience and earning some money before going to university.

Financing Various Projects:

After a two-year pause, a Christmas celebration for the entire school was organized once again. The funding covered the festive meal, including drinks and fruits, for 600 people, including the students, their families, and the immediate neighbourhood. Additionally, the annual staff Christmas event, including an overnight stay at a beachfront hotel in the nearby area, was financed.

Land Costs:

In October, Phase 1 of the construction project was funded, which included the foundation wall around the property and a large entrance gate. In December, Phase 2 was funded and completed, which involved the construction of a small building as an "Administrative Block."

Transfer and/or Bank Fees:

The fees for the monthly transfer to Kenya vary depending on the amount to be transferred: the higher the amount, the higher the fee. In December, there are also the annual fees for account management and cash deposits from our Swiss bank.
